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
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EDITOR'S MESSAGE

The Digital Library: Where Technology Meets Curiosity


Functioning as a powerful extension of the Central Library, the Digital Library is equipped with highspeed, internet-enabled


Farewell Shraddhanjali to late Dr. Manmohan Singh
